Government: British colony from 1807 to 1890 when the island became part of Germany.

Area: 1 square mile

Population: 2300 c.1880

Standard Coin: Same as Great Britain and Germany.

Philatelic history:

Mar., 1867: First stamps issued.

Aug. 10, 1890: Became part of Germany.
